# FROM THE DIRECTOR — Bug's Books 2021

YES, it's that time of year again! The Shelby County Public Library & the Sentinel-News are working together on the Bug's Books, formerly known as the Reading Reindeer program. The program has been renamed to honor Duanne Puckett, who passed away earlier this year. Over thirty years ago, Duanne was one of the people responsible for starting this worthwhile project. The Library, the school system, and the local newspaper all took on the task of helping children become book-lovers so that they would continue to consider reading an essential part of their lives. That task was creating Reading Reindeer, a program that solicits money to buy books for children who may not have the opportunity ever to own a book. This community service project gives new books to children during the holiday season plus all year long for other special literacy programs.

The goal of **Bug's Books** is not to match books to children's specific interests but to open their minds to the joy of reading by giving them the delight of actually owning a book to enjoy over and over again. This year books will be distributed to children attending Northside Early Childhood Center, Head Start, the Dorman Center, and the Salvation Army project with the Shelbyville Fire Department.

In order to continue meeting the goal of <mark>Bug's Books</mark>, monetary donations are needed to purchase books. We are asking you to donate to <mark>Bug's Books</mark>. 


# Storytime To Go Kits


